6.4. Deaf Culture / The Deaf Rights

Although the rights of deaf individuals are clearly stated in the United Nations Convention on the Human Rights of Persons with Disabilities, very few countries have accepted and implemented these rules.

Persons with disabilities have the right, on an equal basis with others, to have their special cultural and linguistic identity recognised and promoted, including sign languages and deaf culture.

Studies should be conducted to ensure that the education of both the blind and children, is provided in the most appropriate language, communication tools and forms, and in environments that will increase their academic and social development.
